# There are 56 Issued Community Forests in BC


Area	# CFAs	Area (ha)	AAC (m³/ha)**

#### **BCTS Initiatives**

- The June 2013 Effectiveness Review of BCTS highlighted importance of providing benchmark data for Market Pricing System (MPS)
- · Made recommendations focussed on the efficiency of BCTS
- Bill 25 (2015) and Bill 12 (2016) support the recommendations
- Bill 25 enabled BCTS to enter into voluntary disposition agreements with CFAs and other forms of tenure (FNWL, WL).
- Allows licensees to release harvest rights to BCTS for a negotiated amount of money.



#### Bill 12 - Reduced Volume Licences

- Requires support of individual CFAs new or existing (FNWL, WL)
- Help the Minister resolve timber allocation challenges and balance competing interests
- BCCFA is involved in discussions around development of the Regulation that prescribes the financial payment to the holders of reduced non-BCTS licences
- Will be involved in policy development around implementation issues
  Principles document (unique business models)
- Reduced volume licences are a tool that enables government to issue tenures in places where the land base is extremely constrained.
- Situations where additional tenures would be very difficult to issue



## **Expansion of Existing CFAs**

Forest Act Amendment - Royal Assent Regulation will be required – Cabinet approval required

**Key Principles:** 

Apportionment for CFAs in available within the TSA First Nations interests can be effectively addressed

100 hectare threshold for minor boundary adjustment.

## Over 100 hectares will require more formal application:

- Confirm CFA holder licensee is meeting provincial goals and Community Forest objectives
- Public support
