The public has a significant interest in BC's forests:

- Forests cover 2/3's of the land-base
- About 95% of forests are publicly owned


To protect the public's interest in forests government made it law that people who care for BC's forests must be registered with the Forest Professionals BC so they can be held accountable for their conduct and practice.

What is Professional Forestry?

The practice of professional forestry means providing advice or services in relation to trees, forests, forest lands, forest resources, forest transportation systems, or forest ecosystems.

Pathways to the Profession

Registered Professional Forester (RPF)

- FIT route for Canadian Forestry Accreditation Board (CFAB) accredited forestry programs
- ASFIT route for forestry or related programs not certified by CFAB

Registered Forest Technologist (RFT)

- TFT route for FPBC recognized forestry diploma programs
- ASTFT route for non-recognized forestry or allied diploma programs


Affiliated Forest Professional (AFP)

Community of Practice & Regulatory Swim Map




